Independent discovery

Read the clues and create a hypothesis as to how the candy is connected to our unit.

There are 10 slides to view.

View each slide and ask yourself, "What does it mean?"

"How are the slides connected to candy?"

Here are your first two clues.

Read and think about how they are related to candy.

Clue 1
 World War II has

ended but Berlin is still divided.

Clue 2

Berlin had two airports, but they were both destroyed during the air attacks of the war.

Here are the next two clues. How do they connect?

• Clue 3

Six hundred forty-six tons of flour and wheat; 125 tons of cereal; 64 tons of fat; 109 tons of meat and fish; 180 tons of dehydrated potatoes; 180 tons of sugar; 11 tons of coffee; 19 tons of powdered milk; 5 tons of whole milk; 3 tons of fresh yeast; 144 tons of dehydrated vegetables; 38 tons of salt; and 10 tons of cheese was needed

• Clue 4

"How will we know it is your plane?", to which Halvorsen responded that he would wiggle his wings.

Two million West Berliners are cut off from all land and water supplies.

How do these clues connect to candy?



Over 23 tons of this were given away.


• Clue 10
